IMPORTANT

Certified copies

Certified copies are A4-size photocopies that have been stamped on the **front page** of all documents and endorsed as true copies of the originals. Any one of the following people can certify a photocopy:

- School principal
- Registrar of a tertiary education provider
- Barrister or Solicitor
- District Court Registrar or Deputy Registrar
- Justice of the Peace (you can find a list of local Justices of the Peace in the Yellow Pages).

Please note: The person who certifies your documents cannot be a family member, spouse or partner.

- I confirm all of my supporting documents have been certified and endorsed in the way stated above.

If your application is missing documents, or includes documents that are not certified, you will be contacted by a member of the TeachNZ team and granted until the scholarship closing date (14 July) to resupply them.

If you submit your application on the closing date (14 July) or the two days preceding it, you will be granted an extension of three working days to resupply missing and/or non-certified documents.

Please be aware, applications that do not include the required documents by the deadlines stated will be considered incomplete and discarded.
